Your Martinsburg High School Alumni Association is pleased to offer the scholarships listed below. Please take a moment to read about the scholarship(s) for which you are applying so that you may appreciate the history and donors who made these scholarships available. Each year since the establishment of each scholarship, the recipient's name is engraved on an individual plate, which is placed on a plaque and displayed in the entrance hall of the school to continue the legacy of the school and its many successful graduates.

MHS Alumni Association Scholarship: First presented at the annual banquet in 1980, this scholarship was established for any graduating senior who is pursuing any degree in any field of study on a higher level. This scholarship requires a 2.0 GPA minimum and takes into consideration the student's financial need.

Elizabeth Brindle Memorial Scholarship: Established in 1988 by the Board of Directors, this scholarship was created to honor Elizabeth Brindle who was a guiding light and driving force in alumni association work. She faithfully served on the Board of Directors for over 50 years and held the office of Treasurer for 36 of those years. This scholarship is awarded to a graduating senior who is pursuing a degree in any field of study on a higher level.

Fred B. Jackson. Jr. Endowment Scholarship: This award was first presented at the annual banquet held on May 26, 1984, to honor Fred Jackson for his devotion to MHS, especially in the area of sports. This scholarship is awarded to a graduating senior who is pursuing any degree in any field of study on a higher level. The recipient must have a 2.0 GPA minimum and the scholarship takes into consideration the student's financial need.

Hattie W. Snyder Memorial Scholarship: Hattie Webb Snyder graduated from Martinsburg High School in 1910 with the first class to join the MHS Alumni Association. She served as the first secretary and later elected permanent secretary, a post she held until her death in November, 1969. She was a pioneer for females in the insurance business prior to her retirement in 1968. Because she was so instrumental in the formation of the association, in January, 1970, this scholarship was established to reflect her loyalty and longevity. The recipient of this scholarship must show intent to pursue a degree in business administration at a higher level.

Wm. Nelson Dunn. Ir. Memorial Scholarship: Mr. Dunn graduated from MHS in 1925 and received his AB and MA degrees from West Virginia University. He was employed by E. R. Squibb Co. as head of its overseas research and testing department until his retirement in 1971. At that time, he returned to Martinsburg and became active in civic and community affairs, including the MHS Alumni Association. In 1978, his family along with the association established this scholarship to honor his life. The scholarship was to be used to promote students pursuing degrees on a higher level in the field of science.

James Reynolds Memorial Scholarship: Mr. Reynolds was a career printer, who began his career with Martinsburg Journal and moved on to positions with the National Geographic, The Washington Post, and the U.S. Government Printing Office. This scholarship established in 1988 by Kathryn Severs Reynolds in memory of her husband, a graduate of MHS in 1938, is for a senior who is pursuing a degree in a vocational/trade school upon graduation. Personnel from James Rumsey make the selection for the recipient.

All recipients of MHS scholarships receive a monetary sum divided between 1^{st} and 2^{nd} semesters (proof of enrollment must be shown).
